FIRST DAY:

Off-Highway Motor Vehicle Law Enforcement Training – 6 Hours
(POST Control Number 21148)

An introductory course for officers involved with off-highway vehicle law enforcement, public safety, and educational programs. Includes application of Division 16.5 of the California Vehicle Code, OHV requirements, registration, equipment, spark arrestors, and an overview of the green sticker program.

SECOND DAY:

Off-Highway Motor Vehicle Sound Testing Training – 6 Hours
(POST Control Number 21149)

This class offers an overview of how sound is measured, followed by an afternoon of practical, hands-on experiences, operating sound meters, and measuring of a variety of equipment.
