Please accept this letter from the BlueRibbon Coalition, a national trail group, as indication of **support** for your 2010/11 General Ground Operations Grant for Pilot Creek and the Plant Removal Grant.

BRC has reviewed the proposals and believes the size and scope of the grant package is certainly appropriate considering the importance of your facility that provides both developed and dispersed "backcountry" OHV recreational opportunities.

BRC believes the Plant Removal Grant appropriately uses the California Conservation Corp to perform the task of eradicating scotch-broom and other invasive species as part of the mitigation measures identified in the current Travel Management Plan so that approximately 19 miles of new OHV trails can be added to the system. Many of these trails act as connectors and are important elements of the TMR Decision.
