The directions in the appendix (page 7) seem to indicate the latter but I can't find a checkbox in the wizard for Form C.</p>	<p>Date: 8/1/2007 Form C, Application Summary, is auto-populated based on responses provided by the Applicant in the Grant Application Wizard.</p>
<p>2. At the 2nd workshop – it was mentioned that we should hand write the page number sequentially on our hard copy applications if we wanted to refer to a certain page when we are before the commission.</p>	<p>Date: 8/1/2007 We are requesting Applicants to write page numbers sequentially on the bottom of their application. The purpose of the page numbers is to provide the ability to reference particular pages of an application.</p> <p>Note: Page numbering is not a requirement. Applicants will not be disqualified if page numbers are not included.</p>
<p>3. Regarding Question #13, (Q #13: <i>Provide clarification on form A for exactly what is required for Q. 4. Response instructions say "number (s) of districts etc. Would this be for entire unit, National Forest or only congressional districts that the project applications span geographically?</i> A #13: <i>The applicant should indicate the legislative districts that are geographically covered by the proposed project areas.</i>) does the on-line answer, change the instruction Division staff gave at the Sacramento training session? The answer provided was to use "the headquarters for congressional districts", not the project areas. Please confirm.</p>	<p>Date: 8/8/2007 The on-line answer applies. The applicant should enter the number(s) of the legislative districts for which are geographically covered by the proposed project area(s).</p>

<p>4. I submitted a question earlier regarding applying for specific project planning for trail reroutes. Would the project performance period be 3 years (for the planning) or would it be for 1 year as the other items in trail maintenance?</p>	<p>Date: 8/9/2007</p> <p>The type of project determines the project performance period. The project performance period is three (3) years for planning projects and fifteen (15) months for trail maintenance projects.</p> <p>The distinction between a Planning project and a Trail Maintenance project may need further clarification to answer this question.</p> <p>For the purposes of this program, a Planning project is a general study/planning to determine which routes need re-engineering and related CEQA work.</p> <p>A Trail Maintenance project would include planning, engineering and CEQA for a specific trail.</p>
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
