Additionally, the lack of comments by the OHMVR Division to any specific applicant does not ensure successful results for the applicant within the competitive grant process or a commitment of funding.

All final applications will be reviewed by the OHMVR Division. The OHMVR Division may, at its sole discretion, decrease the requested amount and eliminate activities pursuant with regulation Section 4970.07.2 (f)(1-5) and for law enforcement projects, regulation Section 4970.15.3(b)(1-5).

Failure by applicant to respond to any OHMVR Division comment of their preliminary application shall be cause for eliminating that item from the applicant's application.

If multiple proposed projects are requesting funding for the same deliverable, and multiple projects are successful, only one project will receive funding for the deliverable.

For proposed projects requesting grant funding for snow and/or winter activities. Applicants must ensure the activities and/or equipment requested are not and/or cannot be funded by the OHMVR Division Winter Program (commonly referred to as the Snow Grooming Program).

For proposed projects requesting grant funding for the maintenance of roads and/or trails, note that only roads and/or trails that allow "green sticker" off-highway vehicles are allowed to receive grant funding.

Applicants are reminded that no grant funds and/or match can be expended or project activities conducted in any land owned or managed by the California Department of Parks and Recreation.

All costs associated with training staff, whether volunteer or paid, are indirect. Applicant must provide more job duty details and move indirect costs to the Indirect category. • Materials/Supplies – "Handtags", Applicant must provide a description for what these are and how they are related to the proposed project. • Other – "Outdoor billboard – Sacramento 1", Applicant must explain why the billboard description indicates two locations, but the quantity is 4. Also, Applicant 	

- must explain the rationale for having two billboard ads verses one strategically placed billboard ad.
- Other – “Outdoor billboard – - South Lake Tah”, Applicant must explain why it is necessary to have four billboard ads. Also, Applicant must explain the “Qty” and “Rate”.

Evaluation Criteria

- #4 - Applicant must explain how the Tahoe Basin management Unit is a partner to this grant project.
- #4 – Applicant must explain which BLM office(s) is a partner and explain how they are a partner to the project.
- #4 – Applicant must provide an explanation for how the other listed partners are partners to the project.
- #5 – Selection is not addressed in the Project Description; “Snowmobile”. Applicant must provide additional information substantiating all selections made.
- #6 - Meeting was more than 12 months before the preliminary application deadline.
- #7 – Narrative does not support the selections; “Process of researching issues and audience”. Research presented is for areas outside of California. Applicant must provide clearly identifiable and/or measurable, elements to substantiate the selection for California OHV issues and audience.
- #8 – Narrative does not support the selection; “Social Media”. Applicant must provide additional information explaining how the section will be utilized for OHV education in the project.
