Role of the Road & Trail Management Plan (RTMP)

- Provides detailed direction to guide the operation, maintenance, and development of the road and trail system while protecting sensitive natural and cultural resources.
- It can:
 - Identify new trail routes and recreational opportunities
 - Address the future of non-system trails
 - Change allowed uses for specific trails or zones
 - Identify trailhead facility improvements (parking, restrooms, etc.)
 - Identify educational and interpretive needs for the trail system (wayfinding signs, education programs, etc.)
 - Protect natural and cultural resources








Overnight Camping




Motocross Practice Track Expansion




Process for Defining Trail Riding in Zones 2, 3 and 4




Change of Use in Motorized Recreation Zones




Hiking Access To Vernal Pool Management Areas
