IMPORTANT INFORMATION ABOUT YOUR DRINKING WATER

MONITORING REQUIREMENTS NOT MET FOR [CALIFORNIA STATE PARKS, HOLLISTER HILLS (System No. 3510302)]

Our water system failed to monitor as required for drinking water standards during the past year and, therefore, was in violation of the regulations. Even though this failure was not an emergency, as our customers, you have a right to know what you should do, what happened, and what we did to correct this situation.

We are required to monitor your drinking water for specific contaminants on a regular basis. Results of regular monitoring are an indicator of whether or not our drinking water meets health standards. During February and March 2022, we did not comply with State monitoring requirements, specifically, California Code of Regulations, title 22, sections 64422 and 64423 for bacteriological monitoring and therefore, cannot be sure of the quality of our drinking water during that time.

What should I do?

- There is nothing you need to do at this time.
- The table below lists the contaminant(s) we did not properly test for during the last year, how many samples we are required to take and how often, how many samples we took, when samples should have been taken, and the date on which follow-up samples were (or will be) taken.

| Contaminant | Required Sampling Frequency | Number of Samples Taken | When All Samples Should Have Been Taken | When Samples Were or Will Be Taken |
|-----------------------|------------------------------|-------------------------|---|---|
| total coliform | 3 samples every month | 0 samples taken | February 2022 & March 2022 | April 2022 and monthly thereafter. |
| E-Coli | 3 samples every month | 0 samples taken | February 2022 & March 2022 | April 2022 and monthly thereafter. |

- If you have health issues concerning the consumption of this water, you may wish to consult your doctor.

What happened? What is being done?

Once it was discovered that the samples were not taken by the responsible employee, Management ensured the required park samples were collected and tested starting again during April 2022 and has continued since. California State Parks strives to maintain drinking water that meets all applicable drinking water standards as required under State Law and will continue to test water at designated locations throughout Hollister Hills State Recreation Area (System No. 3510302).
